Bicycle is the preferred mode of transportation in the two-blockwide New Jersey shore town where the Millar family escapes every summer. "I pride myself on the number of days our car doesn't move," says Jennifer Millar, whose tandem/baby seat/ training wheels bike caravan includes her husband, Lowell, and children Jessica, 10; Nicole, 8; L.J., 6; Chase, 4; and William, 2. On a typical morning the crew takes off for the local bakery then returns to spend the rest of the day at the house, scampering up the wide front porch, through the open first floor, and right out to the beach. Jennifer, one of seven siblings, throws frequent get-togethers that may include as many as 20 children under age 10.
